Outreach and Interfaith Activities Aug-Dec 2025.

The GBT Outreach and Interfaith Committee continued its busy work throughout the latter half of 2025.

July/ August. 50 backpacks filled with several school supplies needed for the students were donated to the underprivileged children in Carroll County through the **Shepherd's Staff** organization in downtown Westminster. GBT has been participating in this very meaningful project for the past few years. Members Kakali Sarkar and Ankur Patel spearheaded the project for GBT.

On **September 21** – Eleven members from our congregation joined Team GBT and participated in the **Alzheimer's Walkathon** at Centennial Park in Howard County to raise awareness of this devastating illness. Team GBT raised over \$2000 for Alzheimer's disease research and support. Ram Sankar was GBT's liaison for the event.

In **September** Members Kali Mallik, Geetha Raja and Vimala Naganna attended the groundbreaking ceremony for Shepard's Staff's new building in Westminster.

In **October** – Members Indrani Chakrabarti and Kali Mallik attended the Annual Dinner sponsored by the Interfaith Alliance for Racial Justice of Carroll County. It was well attended by several faith-based groups in Carroll County. GBT is a member of the Alliance.

In October- Members Kunal Gangopadhyay and Ram Sanka were invited guests in an online study group of First and Franklin Presbyterian Church in downtown Baltimore. The members were studying Hinduism. Kunal and Ram gave a power point presentation on Hinduism which was much appreciated by the group. The Church members were invited to visit our temple.

October/November. The Annual Diwali Food and Clothing Drive. - GBT donated thirteen boxes of food and fourteen boxes of clothing for distribution to the needy in Carroll County and Baltimore County. The committee thanks each and everyone who opened their hearts to help those in need during Diwali. On October 31- Six members participated in the last soup kitchen service for 2025 in downtown Westminster. Member Geetha Kumar planned and led the cooking of the nutritious hot meal.

As the year 2025 ends the committee thanks the GBT community for the support and the generosity shown for their fellow human beings who are less fortunate. It gives us continued enthusiasm and vigor to carry on the outreach work on behalf of our temple.

Cultural Program Roundup

The past few months at the temple have seen a range of cultural events, aimed at celebrating momentous occasions and fostering a spirit of seva. In August, we observed Ganesh Chaturthi, which was marked by Ganesh puja, bhajans, and offerings. In September, the new year of the Bal Vihar program, and the Srimad Bhagavad Gita study group began, encouraging discourse and deeper understanding of our history, and of sacred texts. The temple also held events to celebrate the festival of Navratri, with many vibrant evenings of raas garba that were filled with music, dancing, and joy. Later events included Mata ki Chowki and Kanya Puja, enriching the atmosphere of devotion. In October, the temple was blessed with the opportunity to hold Navagraha Pranpratishta (October 3-5), inaugurating idols of the nine celestial bodies. The celebrations included pujas and devotional performances. Furthermore, on October 20, a grand Diwali celebration was held, which included Mahalakshmi Puja, Aarti, and Mahaprasad, followed by Annakut the next day. In November, devotees gathered for Tulsi Vivah, celebrating the divine union of Lord Vishnu and Devi Tulsi. Between these events, recurring opportunities for bhajans and daily temple activities flourished.

In addition to these celebrations, the temple presented many occasions for seva. The temple hosted initiatives such as the annual Diwali Food and Clothing drive, a school supply drive on Gandhi Jayanti, senior citizen programs on financial planning and fraud prevention, a walkathon to end Alzheimer's, and a health fair offering free health screenings, wellness resources, and health education. In early September, the temple established its first vegetable garden, supporting a youth project. The temple also held its annual fundraising dinner and musical evening, garnering support for temple activities and initiatives for the coming year. We thank all devotees and volunteers for their continued support of temple programs.
